

2023 – Beginning to see Fruits of our Labours

2023 has been a very interesting and productive year, starting with celebrations for our new logo designed by Emily Pooley of the West Bank First Nation. Her poetic vision beautifully links the Okanagan Nation's knowledge of N'tityx, the Salmon, to the origin of a trail that joined all communities in our valley. We are very grateful to have her artistic work as the symbol of the Trail of the Okanagans.

New "All Ages and Ability" trails were also added to our network in 2023. First was the completion of the multi-use pathway along Campbell Rd on WFN lands in West Kelowna. This section is important as it is the first piece of pathway off the bridge from Kelowna. In Summerland, the Giant's Head multi-use pathway extension added another 3 km of protected pathway. For 2024, we are in the final phases of applying for the remaining funding for the Peachland to Goats Peak Park pathway and hope to be building it next year.

2023 also saw the completion of the Active Transportation Network Plan in Peachland, the Summerland Downtown Revitalization Plan and the Osoyoos Active Transportation Plan, each of which reference and include the Trail of the Okanagans in these official plans. Summerland even made our Trail a catalyst project!

Lastly, we had a very sad September with the passing of long time Director, Doris Muhs of Peachland. Doris was an enthusiastic supporter of our vision and she is very much missed.







Why a new logo?


The Trail of the Okanagans is named for the traditional trading route of the Syilx people that spanned the Okanagan Valley. This 6,000-year-old trail connected Syilx communities, important cultural locations and provided a ribbon of trade connecting the peoples of the Columbia River system to the peoples of the Fraser River.

And yet the original logo for the Trail of the Okanagans did not reflect this rich traditional history or the cultural values of the Syilx people.

In this time of cultural reconciliation, the Trail of the Okanagans Society realized that we needed to do better, to reach out, to learn and to involve the Syilx people in all aspects of the trail. Rethinking our logo was a first step in this process.




